#### The Resilient Project - Grounding exercises

Grounding exercises are activities that both adults and children can use to bring them back to the present moment. There are various types of grounding activities for kids, from quick strategies like deep breathing to more formal techniques, such as meditation. There is no right or wrong way to ground oneself as different strategies work for each individual. The goal is to find one that anchors you in the here and now.

Grounding techniques are helpful for situations where children may find themselves overwhelmed or confused by distressing thoughts and emotions. Kids also experience strong emotions, stressful circling thoughts, or painful memories and flashbacks. Doing grounding exercises can help bring them back down to earth.

Effective grounding exercises engage the senses through techniques like visualisation and deep breathing to redirect anxious thoughts and feelings. Involving the other senses such as hearing, touch, taste, and smell can help kids regain control over their thoughts and physical responses. This works by interrupting the automatic response to anxiety, allowing the mind and body to return to a state of safety. (Vallejo, 2002)

You may like to explore one or more of the following grounding exercises shown on this <u>video</u> for yourself or with your child/ren.

Remember, grounding exercises should be done as soon as sensations of distress or anxiety surface. Practising the techniques this way enables children to use them when negative feelings intensify.

Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training

Staff at Bethany are supported in Child Safety Standard 8 by having regular training sessions to help recognise indicators of child harm. An example of this was a recent staff meeting where all the eleven standards were presented and clearly outlined for all. Staff are also informed on how to effectively respond to issues of child safety and are always supported by leadership. Information and resources are offered to help staff and volunteers implement Bethany's Child Safety and Wellbeing policies.

#### **Concessional Fee Policy:**

The concessional fee policy was introduced to support families struggling to pay school fees. Concessional school fees are available to any family that meets the below eligibility criteria:

- Holding a valid HCC and eligible for CSEF
- Experiencing severe financial hardship
- Holding a DVA Gold Card
- Identified as refugees and holding an ImmiCard
- Of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage

You will also be required to complete a form as a part of the process to determine eligibility. Should you wish further information re this funding or if you have questions as to whether you are eligible, please do not hesitate to contact the school and ask to speak to Joanne Webster.
