#### A few reminders: -

- Please remember students should not be at school before 8:30am, as there is no teacher supervision at this time.

- The date for Year 6 Graduation this year, is **Wednesday 11th December at 6:00pm.** All students are to wear full school uniform.
- The last assembly for the year will be held on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> December at 2:10pm. Please place in your diaries.
- Year 6 will also be attending the Graduation excursion on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> December. This is also their last day of school.
- School Reports will be available through nforma on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> December.

As you prepare to buy shoes for your child for the new school year, please ensure they meet the School Uniform requirements. **Black school shoes not runners** are to be worn with the full school uniform. **Runners are only to be worn with sports uniform.** Please understand this will be compulsory in the new school year. I thank you as always for your co-operation with this.

Again, I ask you to be mindful of the safety on Retford Drive. The current situation has become increasingly hazardous due to a number of issues:

- Cars performing U-turns in the middle of the road
- Children and parents darting between vehicles to cross the road
- Parents using the drop-off zone as a parking area, leaving their cars to chat or walk their children into school
- Vehicles blocking the school crossing, making it difficult for pedestrians to cross safely
- Cars parking on the speed humps, obstructing the road and disrupting traffic flow

These behaviours not only cause significant congestion but also create dangerous conditions for children, parents, and staff. Unfortunately if this continues the school will be forced to call the council and request the use of traffic inspectors.

The last assembly for the year will be held **on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> December at 2:10pm** in the School Hall. Thank yous and awards will be given at this time. All are welcome.

#### Last day for lunch orders is next Friday 13th December.

The last day of Term 4 will be **Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> December for all students and we will finish at 12:30pm**. **This will be a casual dress day for all.**

#### **Concessional Fee Policy:**

The concessional fee policy was introduced to support families struggling to pay school fees. Concessional school fees are available to any family that meets the below eligibility criteria:

- Holding a valid HCC and eligible for CSEF
- Experiencing severe financial hardship
- Holding a DVA Gold Card
- Identified as refugees and holding an ImmiCard
- Of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage

You will also be required to complete a form as a part of the process to determine eligibility. Should you wish further information re this funding or if you have questions as to whether you are eligible, please do not hesitate to contact the school and ask to speak to Joanne Webster.
