#### **Inform and Empower Term 3**

We continue our strong partnership with Inform and Empower who run termly incursions with our students. This term the themes for the incursions are based on creating a digital footprint, developing a balance between green time and screen time, navigating uncomfortable situations and cyberbullying.





The students in the Exploration and Discovery Centres are learning about the five golden rules when using ipads as well as creating their own digital footprint. In the Discovery Centre students are learning to create usernames and passwords that are safe, not to share or post personal information online, as well as relying on trusted adults when things go wrong.

#### Key takeaways from the incursion were:

There are some types of information we need to keep private online, such as our name, address, school, passwords and photos. If someone online asks us for any personal information, we need to tell one of our trusted adults who can help us block and report. We need to keep our personal information private because the internet can be accessed by everyone - and not everyone is a trusted person.



#### **Conversation starters for parents:**

Let's look at your usernames and passwords together and see how safe they are.

What should we do if someone in a game or app asks us for personal information, such as your name, address or photos?

If you were in a game on the internet with a player called "pinktiger12", how old do you think this person could be? Boy? Girl? Man? Woman? Safe? Unsafe?

Students in the Bridging and Leadership Centres will learn about Cyberbullying which is an important part of National Week against Bullying and Violence. This incursion will cover topics such as navigating uncomfortable situations, being an upstander, consent and seeking help strategies.

The students will learn that there are times when we are online and we feel uncomfortable. This may be because we have seen something that we should not have or something that has been said to us. It occurs in apps, websites and games.

When navigating uncomfortable situations online, we encourage students to seek help, record/screen shot, report the incident, block or change settings, walk away and take a break.



#### Conversation starters for parents:

Can you think of a time when you, or someone you know, felt uncomfortable online? Have you ever been on the Kids Helpline website? Let's check it out together. Have you ever had to block or report another user? What happened? What does it mean to be an upstander? What are examples of things you could do or say to be an upstander?

#### Positive Behaviour for Learning

#### The Resilient Project

#### Revisiting 'Empathy'

Empathy is understanding and sharing the feelings of other people. During this month's special video message on the TRP website, Martin shares the importance of developing empathy with our students and their families.

The key question he asks his audience is: What is something kind you have done for someone else who has been feeling sad?

We encourage families to watch his <u>video</u> on ways we can be kind to others, and brainstorm ways to be empathetic with those we interact with throughout the week.

#### **Happy Families**

This week's article challenges us to reflect on ourselves as parents and how much time we give to our children. Are we actually 'present' with them when they need us or are we 'preoccupied' with doing something else?

The article STOP, LOOK and LISTEN to your KIDS has a nice and kind reminder to us all:

- STOP. Stop what you are doing. Completely. Put down the phone. Turn away from the screen. Turn down the stove. (But keep your eyes on the road if you're driving!)
- LOOK. Look at your child in the eyes. You might crouch down so you can hold hands. Make that visual connection.
- LISTEN. Keep that mouth zipped. Just listen. Keep looking at your child and really pay attention.

We all live in busy worlds and are constantly modelling to our children what is important. Enjoy the read and see if you can make one small change. Good Luck.

#### **Concessional Fee Policy:**

The concessional fee policy was introduced to support families struggling to pay school fees. Concessional school fees are available to any family that meets the below eligibility criteria:

- Holding a valid HCC and eligible for CSEF
- Experiencing severe financial hardship
- Holding a DVA Gold Card
- Identified as refugees and holding an ImmiCard
- Of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage
